The conference is to be held on 1 & 2 April 2020 from 9.30am to 4.30pm at the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation in Joondalup.

Hydropolis 2020 aims to explore a number of topics that will assist in the implementation of the WA Government's recently released Waterwise Perth Action Plan, including mechanisms to encourage new developments, including those in infill areas, to be more waterwise and document the characteristics of 'good-practice' waterwise urban development.

We encourage professionals, students, young professionals, institutes, universities and organisations to share their experiences.

- Performance of stormwater management systems
- Managing stormwater in infill development – issues and solutions
- Integrating stormwater into streets and parks
- Managing stormwater in small spaces
- Understanding stormwater and groundwater interactions
- Modelling approaches and assumptions and ARR2019
- Erosion and sediment control
- Stormwater as a resource in Perth

Submission Guidelines

- Hydropolis 2020 is a two day conference featuring invited keynote speakers (Day 1) and research papers followed by a workshop (Day 2).
- Submissions on any topic related to the Hydropolis themes (above) will be considered.
- Presentations may be between 10 and 30 mins, with duration to be advised by the selection committee.
- Papers should include (approximate word limits in brackets):
 - Overview (150 words) –provide an overview of your conference paper
 - Objectives (100 words) –state the main objective and rationale of your paper
 - Methods (200 words) –outline the methods used to achieve the objectives of the paper
 - Results (200 words) – describe the achieved or planned results
 - Conclusions (100 words) – draw conclusions about the implications of your research/project for the future development of Perth and Peel
- Alternatively, a 300-500 word abstract may be provided which describes the content and key messages of the proposed presentation.
- Submissions must include a biography of the presenter of up to 150 words. Submissions not including a biography of the presenter will not be considered.
- Contributors will be provided with advice of acceptance or rejection of their submission by email including the duration of the presentation. The Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any submissions.
- Should a submission be accepted, authors are encouraged to provide a written paper for inclusion in the Conference Proceedings.
- Abstracts should be in English, minimum of 10 point font, submitted in Microsoft Word
